GARBAGE COLLECTION

Household garbage must be placed curbside in front of your residence no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the evening before your scheduled collection day and no later than 7:00 a.m. the day of your collection. The village will collect from residential private dwellings the equivalent of two thirty-two-gallon containers per family each collection day.

Garbage must be placed curbside in the Village issued cart or container in a location that is easily accessible. Garbage containers have been issued to all residents. Additional containers are available through Village Hall at a rental cost of \$156.00/year.

BULK TRASH ITEMS

DPW collects bulk debris from residents on Fridays (excluding Holiday weeks) **by appointment only**. Large household bulk items (furniture, mattresses, etc.) must be left curbside (for multi-family dwellings, place near where your garbage is normally deposited) no earlier than the evening prior to collection and no later than 7:00 a.m. the day of pick-up. **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS IS PROHIBITED FROM COLLECTION.** Mattresses and box springs must be sealed in plastic. Mattress bags are available for purchase at Village Hall at a cost of \$3.00 per bag. Smaller items that fit into a village-issued trash container will be collected with your normal household garbage.

Please call or visit the DPW webpage to schedule a Bulk Trash Pick-Up. Requests are due by Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. for same week service

YARD WASTE

The Village of Tarrytown Department of Public Works collects Yard Waste/Organic material on Thursdays - unless stated otherwise (Holidays, Snow Removal, etc.).

Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in BIO-DEGRADEABLE paper bags and placed curbside for collection.

Brush and branches up to four (4) inches in diameter must be bundled and tied. Bundles must not exceed three (3) feet in length and placed curbside for collection.

LOGS AND STUMPS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

RECYCLING

Recyclables that are placed at curbside for collection must be placed loosely in a clearly marked container for recyclables. Recycling container must be placed curbside no later than 7:00 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection (Wednesday's for residential households).

Plastic bags containing recyclable items will not be collected. Recyclable items placed together with non-recyclable materials will not be collected. Household garbage placed for collection containing recyclable items will not be taken.

WHAT DO RECYCLING SYMBOLS ON PLASTICS MEAN?



PET, PETE
(Polyethylene Terephthalate)

- Soft drink, water and salad dressing bottles; peanut butter and jam jars...
- Suitable to store cold or warm drinks. Bad idea for hot drinks.



HDPE
(High-density Polyethylene)

- Water pipes, milk, juice and water bottles; grocery bags, some shampoo / toiletry bottles...



PVC
(Polyvinyl Chloride)

- Not used for food packaging.
- Pipes, cables, furniture, clothes, toys...



LDPE
(Low-density Polyethylene)

- Frozen food bags; squeezable bottles, e.g. honey, mustard; cling films; flexible container lids...



PP
(Polypropylene)

- Reusable microwaveable ware; kitchenware; yogurt containers; microwaveable disposable take-away containers; disposable cups; plates...



PS
(Polystyrene)

- Egg cartons; packing peanuts; disposable cups, plates, trays and cutlery; disposable take-away containers.



Other
(often polycarbonate or ABS)

- Beverage bottles; baby milk bottles; compact discs; "unbreakable" glazing; lenses including sunglasses, prescription glasses, automotive headlamps, riot shields, instrument panels...

Hazardous Items: Dispose at H-MRF or Appropriate Vendor

Do not dispose in trash or recycling. Empty containers that held hazardous materials go in the trash (not in recycling).

- ✖ Batteries (all non-alkaline)
- ✖ Bulbs: CFL or fluorescent tube

ELECTRONICS

Tarrytown does not offer curbside service for electronic debris. Residents may dispose of electronic items at the DPW Facility eWaste container at 4 Division Street daily between 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday (except Holidays).

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Televisions, VCR's, DVR'S, DVD'S
Computers, Monitors, Keyboards
Printers, Scanners, Fax Machines
Video Games / Devices
Microwave Ovens

Small corded appliances may be disposed of in the regular garbage. Cell phones are not accepted as either eWaste or garbage.

BULK METAL COLLECTION

DPW will collect metal items curbside on Friday's by appointment only. Please call the DPW Office to arrange a pickup or visit the DPW webpage to make an appointment.

Items must be made of metal only and must be free of any other material (fabric, wood, etc.) including fluids.

OTHER NON-COLLECTABLE ITEMS:

SHARPS : Proper disposal of needles is important to the safety of workers who handle your trash. For disposal, please use a leak proof, shatterproof and puncture proof container with a screw top. Apply tape to the lid and include with your normal trash. However, it is preferred and safer to take the container to a "Sharps" disposal site listed on the Westchester County website.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Throughout the month of January, DPW will collect discarded (real) Christmas Trees on Thursday's (Organic Collection Day). Trees must be free any foreign objects (tree stands, ornaments, lights etc.). Please place trees safely at the curb.

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

The Village does NOT collect the following:

Automotive fluids, flammable liquids, polishes, pesticides, insecticides, swimming pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, pharmaceuticals, propane tanks, batteries. The County of Westchester hosts several dates where you can drop off your items. Please call (914) 813-5425 for more information.

FOOD SCRAP COLLECTION PROGRAM

KEEP THE HEAVY STUFF OUT OF THE LANDFILL WITH THIS POPULAR TARRYTOWN PROGRAM!

Accepted Items

- ☐ Fish and Shellfish (shells ok)
- ☐ Dairy Products
- ☐ Bread and Pasta
- ☐ Rice and Grains
- ☐ Egg Shells
- ☐ Chips and Snacks
- ☐ Nuts and Seeds
- ☐ Leftover, Spoiled and Expired Food (cooked ok)
- ☐ Coffee Grounds (paper filters ok)

Items NOT Accepted:

- ☐ **NO** Plastic bags, plastic packaging or wrappers – use only compostable bags or paper bags
- ☐ **NO** Baby/Hand wipes
- ☐ **NO** Pet waste

The Village of Tarrytown has established a drop-off location for **household food scraps** on Green St: Cross the “H” bridge over the MNR tracks, turn Left (South) and travel along the street past the commuter parking lots. The drop-off is on the right, just before the Losee Park ballfield. There are specially-marked bins in place to collect food scraps from the residents of the Village of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow.

The collected food scraps are transferred to a commercial composting facility upstate to be recycled into nutrient-rich compost. This program minimizes the remaining trash from our community that gets incinerated, and helps keep Tarrytown a sustainable community!

PLEASE NOTE: The County of Westchester provides once per week pick up of our food scraps. Please help us manage the site with your timely and tidy disposal.

Tips:

- ☐ Please use only compostable bags (not plastic or “bio-degradable” bags) for your scraps. Additional liner bags are available for \$2 for a roll of 25 bags at the Warner Library and the Tarrytown Rec Center.
- ☐ To reduce odors, we recommend saving meat, fish, and bone leftovers in your freezer until ready to transfer to the drop-off site.



Complete compost collection kits (kitchen counter caddy, roll of liner bags, and a larger locking bulk transporter) are available for \$20 from the Warner Library and the Tarrytown Rec Center.

OTHER DPW SERVICES

WATER The Village of Tarrytown operates its own Water System. You can view the Annual Water Quality Reports on the DPW webpage. If you experience low pressure or discolored water, please call (914) 631-0356. Discolored water usually occurs when there is a water main break or during fire hydrant usage. In case of discolored water, please run your water for 10-15 minutes. The village usually flushes fire hydrants on an annual basis.

STREET LIGHTS To report a streetlight that is out of order, please call DPW at (914) 631-0356 and give the Pole Number (W# or NYT#) and the address of the light that is not working.

LEAF COLLECTION From early November to mid-December, DPW will collect loose leaves twice from all village streets. See the following Leaf Collection Schedule and Guidelines. We strongly urge to use leaf bags or mulch the leaves into your lawn.

SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT PROGRAM Property owners are responsible for the sidewalks abutting their property. During the summer months residents may have their sidewalk replaced under the sidewalk replacement policy section 259-56 of the Code of the Village. The resident reimburses the Village of Tarrytown for the materials required to complete the installation of new sidewalk. The Village will provide the labor and equipment to perform this work at no cost to the property owner.

SNOW REMOVAL

The village will deploy salters and plows to keep the roads safe and clear of ice and snow. In certain instances, DPW will apply a brine coating to the roads to prevent an ice bond to the surface of the road. Property owners are responsible for the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks contiguous to their property. Property owners must NOT deposit snow onto the street.

Please read Village Code below:

§ 259-37 (SNOW) Removal by owner or occupant required.

- A.** The owner or occupant of any premises shall cause the contiguous sidewalks and, in the case of multifamily dwellings, all driveways and access and exit roads on the premises to be cleared of snow and ice within 18 hours after such snowfall shall have ceased or ice shall have formed, except in the case of properties in the Restricted Retail Zoning Districts and the Neighborhood Shopping Zoning Districts in the Village, which shall have the snow and ice removed at all times between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- B.** Where snow has melted and shall be frozen or where there has been an ice storm and the contiguous sidewalks shall be frozen, the ice shall be removed within two hours. The two hour period shall not apply between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. Should the snow have melted and shall be frozen or where there has been an ice storm and the contiguous sidewalk shall be frozen during the period from 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., the snow and ice shall be removed by 7:00 a.m. If the melted snow and ice shall be frozen to a degree that it cannot be removed within said period by customary means, the owner or occupant of the abutting premises shall cause salt, sand, ashes, sawdust or other suitable material to be strewn upon the sidewalks, driveways and access and exit roads within the said period. The said sidewalk shall as soon thereafter as weather conditions permit be thoroughly cleared of snow and ice.

The hours of leaf collection occur during a normal DPW work day - 7:00a.m to 3:00 p.m. according to the schedule beginning the second week of November. On the day of your scheduled collection, please refrain from parking on the street to allow DPW crews to safely and efficiently collect the leaf piles. Due to conditions beyond our control, your scheduled day may be delayed.

The following rules apply to leaf collection and will be strictly enforced by Code Enforcement or Tarrytown PD:

- 1. Leaves must not be placed at the curb prior to the weekend before your scheduled collection date.**
- 2. Leaves must be piled at the edge of the curb and NOT in the travel lane of the road.**
- 3. Leaf piles mixed with any other materials – brush, twigs, pumpkins, etc. – will not be collected. The county only accepts leaves.**
- 4. All leaves placed curbside prior to the beginning and after the conclusion of the leaf collection season must be placed in biodegradable paper bags to be collected during normal organic collection (Thursdays)**
