Board of Trustees Village of Tarrytown Regular Meeting No. 17 October 5, 2016 8:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Mayor Fixell presiding; Trustees: Brown, Butler, Hoyt, McGee, McGovern and Zollo; Village Administrator Blau; Village Treasurer Hart; Village Attorney Silverberg and Village Clerk Booth

REPORTS

Trustee McGovern reported the following:

- Scarecrow Making will be held on Saturday, October 15th at Patriots Park at 10:30 a.m. The Village will decorate the downtown area with these festive scarecrows.
- Window Painting will be held on Wednesday, October 19th on Broadway from 3:30 to 5:30 for children in grades 2nd to 5th.
- Rag-a-Muffin Parade will be held on Saturday, October 22nd at Patriots Park at 2 p.m.
- The Annual Halloween Parade will be held on Saturday, October 29th at 5:30 p.m. For more information and to register a group or float, go to www.tarrytownhalloweenparade.com.
- The new Recreation and Fitness Center, located on the west side of the train tracks, is now opened. At this time, Village residents can register for membership in the fitness center between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. You will receive a picture I.D. card, which will allow entrance into the fitness center. More information can be found on the website, tarrytowngov.com or call the Recreation Department at 631-8347.

Trustee McGee noted that the Friends of the Warner Library are holding their Fall Book Sale on October 15 and 16 (Saturday and Sunday) from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Trustee Hoyt noted that tomorrow, Thursday, October 6th, the Tarrytown Tree Commission will present Best Practices for the Care of Trees at the Warner Library at 7 p.m.

Deidre Dobson Carsto, Tarrytown Tree Warden and member of the Tarrytown Tree Commission, stated that the Tree Commission will be hosting an "Up Close and Personal" presentation on Best Practices for the Care of Trees at the Warner Library, 3rd floor, tomorrow night at 7 p.m. Everyone is welcome. There will be a presentation and then the commission members will take questions about trees or tree permits.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORT

Administrator Blau reported on the following:

<u>Sarah Michaels Park</u> is a Village public park located on the corner of Main Street and Cortlandt Street in front of Asbury Park. Many people thought it was a private park for Asbury Park residents because the park was completely fenced in. The fence has been removed and now the park looks more available and accessible to the public. Mr. Blau has seen more people in the park since the fence came down.

Westchester County Force Main Project – Westchester County, Department of Environmental Facilities, which operates the sewage treatment plants is under a consent decree from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to replace the Force Main, which is a sewer main under pressure. The reason they were under consent decree to replace the sewer main is because this sewer main has broken on a number of occasions. Mr. Blau remembers two times when the sewer main broke, once on McArthur Avenue and swallowed a car and once on Church Street where it created a huge opening in the road. The consent decree has a deadline to get this project done or Westchester County will be subject to severe fines. The work that was done on Church Street and now on Broadway is part of the Force Main project. The Force Main starts down by the railroad tracks, where there is a pump station. The sewage comes in via gravity to the pump station

where it is pumped up the hill and continues through this Force Main to a point on Route 119. This work is strictly a Westchester County project. On Church Street, the County was subject to approval from the Village of Tarrytown Board of Trustees and the Board permitted the work subject to 26 conditions. On Broadway, it is only subject to a permit and permission by the New York State Department of Transportation, which was granted. The Village has made comments and has suggested improvements to the management of the project and also traffic management, but the Village of Tarrytown does not have any control over the project or the process on Broadway and Route 119. The Village held a meeting with the contractor, the County and the State and discussed the current traffic maintenance plan, noting that it needs to be updated and is unacceptable to the Village.

Mayor Fixell asked if anyone wanted to address the Board on agenda items. No one appeared.

PUBLIC HEARING – FISHING BUTTONS (tabled)

Trustee Hoyt moved, seconded by Trustee Zollo and unanimously carried, that the hearing be opened.

Cathy Ruhland, Chairperson of the Tarrytown Lakes Committee, stated that the Lakes Committee would be happy to have a discussion with the Village Board and do research with respect to fishing at the Tarrytown Lakes. She believes these lakes are tiny and don't stock a lot of fish. In order to have more people fish at the lakes, the Village would have to stock more fish and that can be very expensive. Currently, the parking for people who fish seems adequate. If we open fishing to the general public, there will not be adequate parking and there will be more littering and garbage. She supports to continue to allow people to fish at the lakes for the residents of the Town of Greenburgh and the Town of Mount Pleasant. It seems manageable right now.

Joseph Durso, Member of the Tarrytown Lakes Committee, stated that his concern is to maintain the quality and viability of the lakes and its eco system. He guarantees that the lake's eco system could not support the general public to fish at the lakes. He supports to include residents from the Town of Greenburgh and the Town of Mt. Pleasant to fish at the Tarrytown Lakes. Since there has been police enforcement at the Tarrytown Lakes, the number of people who illegally fish has gone down. If we opened fishing to the general public, the enforcement would become a greater problem. There would be more littering and garbage and it could become a safety issue for people who want walk or run the lakes trail.

Trustee Hoyt moved, seconded by Trustee Zollo, and unanimously carried, that the following resolution be approved: Approved: 7-0

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tarrytown does hereby table the public hearing until further notice.

Said appointment is subject to all Westchester Civil Service rules and regulations.

Motion carried, all voting "aye" with the exception of Trustee Butler who abstained for the reason that out of 100 applicants and that the position of laborer is an entry level position in DPW, he believed we should have hired residents of Tarrytown and Trustee McGee recused herself because her sons were both on the hiring list. Approval: 5-0-2

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees does hereby appoint Dennis Montaruli, William Logan and *Julio Sosa to the position of Laborer, Step 1, effective October 6, 2016, at an annual salary of \$47,450.00, subject to all civil service rules and regulations.

*Julio Sosa never reported to work, therefore, appointment is rescinded.
